




- Increased number of RFMOs/RFABs established

RFABs/RFMOs Net(work?)










Regional Fishery Management Organizations (RFMOs – non species-specific)




Regional Fishery Management Organizations (RFMOs – species specific)

FAO and RFBs

- FAO has committed to:
 - provide its technical and administrative support to its own RFBs to strengthening their effectiveness
 - promote collaboration and consultation among all RFBs or arrangements on matters of common concern
 - facilitate meetings of RFB and RFMOs
 - cooperate to report on status and trends of fisheries
 - report to, and liaise with the United Nations and other international and regional organizations regarding collecting and disseminating information
 - assist in the process of establishing new RFBs
 - host and support the Regional Fishery Body Secretariats' Network (RSN)



Characteristics

- Member organizations: secretariats of RFABs and RFMO/As and partners
- RSN is not a FAO body but is supported by FAO
- Biennial meetings
- Decisions by consensus
- Non-binding decisions
- RSN and FAO collaborative background

Main objective

Enhance cooperation and coordination among RFABs/RFMOs to achieve fisheries and aquaculture sustainable development through effective regional mechanisms







Fish stocks regularly assessed



How many fisheries are managed?







