# SIOFA contribution to FAO FIRMS activities

Abstract	
The Fisheries and Resources Monitoring System (FIRMS, http://firms.fao.org) was started in 2014 and draws together international organizations and regional fishery bodies (RFBs) aiming to provide access to a wide range of high-quality information on the global monitoring and management of fishery marine resources.  In 2020, as mandated by the MoP, the SIOFA Executive Secretary has signed a partnership arrangement with FAO for cooperation in the development and maintenance of FIRMS.  This paper provides key updates on the advancement of the SIOFA/FAO-FIRMS cooperation that occurred in 2022.

## Background

The Fisheries and Resources Monitoring System (FIRMS, <a href="http://firms.fao.org">http://firms.fao.org</a>) was started in 2014 and draws together international organizations and regional fishery bodies (RFBs) aiming to provide access to a wide range of high-quality information on the global monitoring and management of fishery marine resources.

At its 4<sup>th</sup> meeting, the SIOFA SC considered a proposal by FAO (<u>SC-04-11</u>) to join the FIRMS (as a Partnership Arrangement or as a Collaborative Arrangement). The SC decided to support this proposal (para 186 of the <u>SC4 Report</u>), which was later ratified by MoP6 (para 174 of the <u>MoP6 Report</u>).

In 2020, as mandated by the MoP, the SIOFA Executive Secretary has signed a partnership arrangement with FAO for cooperation in the development and maintenance of FIRMS.

### **Aims**

This paper aims to provide key updates on the advancement of the SIOFA/FAO-FIRMS cooperation that occurred in 2022.

# SIOFA/FAO-FIRMS cooperation

On mandate of the Executive Secretary, the SIOFA Science Officer engaged with FIRMS starting in September 2022, with the purpose of creating a series of factsheets for the SIOFA area.

FIRMS structures factsheets in two categories: Marine Resources factsheets, and Fisheries factsheets. These deal with the species/taxa being fished, and the fisheries targeting them, respectively. A summary

After a short workshop with FIRMS providing guidance on the navigation and structure of the factsheets, the Science Officer compiled the information available and already published (e.g. utilising the Overview of SIOFA Fisheries 2022). This information was verified internally (e.g. by the Data Officer) prior to submission to firms.

The information submitted was utilised by FIRMS to produce a first draft of the factsheets, which were then circulate to the SIOFA SC Heads of Delegation for any comments that they might have.

The Secretariat collected comments submitted by the SC HoDs and proceeded to a second round of internal checks before providing further feedback to FIRMS.

Finally, a total of 13 marine resources and 9 fisheries SIOFA – FIRMS fact sheets were published on the FIRMS website in February 2023.
