Circular SIOFA 2022-29 Transmission of the SIOFA draft IUU Vessel List and Inclusion of three Sri Lanka tuna fishing vessels in the draft SIOFA 2022 IUU

This is in addition to the letter N0. 2022-DFO-SIOFA 2022 dated 20th April 2022 forwarded by Sri Lanka on the three vessels IMULA 1783 MTR, IMULA 1844 MTR and IMULA 1655MTR currently included to the IUU vessels list of SIOFA.

Sri Lanka would like to provide the catch data reporting log sheets of the two vessels IMULA 1783 MTR and IMULA 1655 MTR as a proving document to emphasise that the two vessels operated for tuna and tuna like species and has not engaged in other fishery. (Annex- I).

Sri Lanka kindly request from the compliance committee of SIOFA to remove the two vessels IMULA 1783 MTR and IMULA 1655 MTR, taking into consideration the provided information and the clarification given in the previous communication.

The vessel IMULA 1844MTR is prosecuting at courts(Case No is BR1425/22) and the log book is in the custody. The next trial date is 15/07/2022. Sri Lanka will report the penalties imposed on this vessel once the prosecution is over.

In future Sri Lanka will timely update the Sri Lanka vessels in the authorised vessels list before departure for fishing preventing same incidents in future.

I appreciate if you would circulate this letter among the members of SIOFA.

Inclusion of three Sri Lanka tuna long line fishing vessels in the draft SIOFA 2022 IUU vessel list 2022.

This is reference to your letter NO. 2022-04-06-01-ES dated 6th April 2022 on the above.

Department of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources Sri Lanka conducted an analysis on the three vessels (IMULA 1783 MTR, IMULA 1844 MTR and IMULA 1655MTR) based on the AIS data provided. The vessel registration, Operation licenses Departure forms and the VMS track were inspected to find the reasons for inclusion of these vessels in the SIOFA draft IUU list 2022.

Our findings are as follows.

The all three vessels are duly registered fishing vessels of Sri Lanka as per the provisions of the Fisheries and Aquatic Resources Act No. 02, and present in the National Vessel registry of Sri Lanka. IMULA 1783 MTR and IMULA 1655 MTR are vessels operate for tuna fishing in high seas, Equipped with VMS on board and authorized at IOTC to operate in IOTC area of competence. .

However the fishing vessel IMULA 1844 MTR is permitted to operate within EEZ of Sri Lanka and allegedly entered to High Seas. This Department investigated on this matter and has already taken actions to prosecute the vessel owner for deploying the vessel for high seas tuna fishing without a valid license, based on the electronic evidence (AIS track) provided by SIOFA.

The summary of status of prosecution is as follows.

Sri Lanka nationals engage in tuna fisheries in the Western Indian Ocean from the ancient times, especially in the area of Saya de Malha Bank, close to the Mauritius. The gears they use are, long line and Gill nets. In the meantime Sri Lanka nationals have no interest of demersal fish species in high seas those comes under the scope of SIOFA. There are no catch recordings nor landing of such species by the vessels operate in the said sea area.

Sri Lanka being a member of IOTC authorize the vessels to operate in the high seas of the western Indian Ocean. Moreover the fisheries authority (DFAR) of Sri Lanka does not hesitate to take legal actions against the fishers who engage in IUU fishing activities violating the national legislations established in the country, based on the international conventions and regional resolutions.

In the section A, item (i) of the provided information by SIOFA, it is mentioned that *“presence of the vessel in the immediate vicinity of the Saya de Malha Bank, indicating that the vessel may have been engaging in fishing activities falling under the purview of SIOFA”*.

In the Section B, item (a) , it is mentioned that “engaged in fishing for fishery resources in the Agreement Area and are not on the SIOFA Record of Authorized Vessels and item (i) “engaged in fishing activities contrary to any other SIOFA CMMS”.


We are have a question, how a vessel being in the area of SIOFA, indicates that the vessels engaged in fishing for the species comes under the scope of SIOFA without real time proven evidence . The DFAR checked the log sheets and the catch landed on arrival and found that no demersal species on board of the three vessels reported by SIOFA.

Sri Lanka is not a CCP and nor vessels of Sri Lanka are in the SIOFA Record of Authorized list, because Sri Lanka vessels are not harvesting the demersal species those manage by SIOFA. In the meantime Due to the late submission of the authorized list of vessels to IOTC Secretariat the two vessels IMULA 1783 MTR and IMULA 1655 MTR are not updated on the authorized list of IOTC. Since the vessel list has been submitted, the two vessels are now on the ALVs of IOTC bearing IOTC number 18106 and 18117 respectively.

I think this clarification is sufficient for you to proceed ahead in the SIOFA to remove the said vessels from the CIOFA draft IUU list based on our clarifications given. In the meantime I would like to bring to your kind notice that though the competent areas of the IOTC and SIOFA are overlapped The fisheries conducted are separate. Therefore without valid, real time, proven evidences it is not reasonable to recommend inclusion of fishing vessels operate in high seas for IUU listing. Sri Lanka is ready to communicate with any reporting country on the IUU fishing activities conducted by vessels fagged to Sri Lanka, to the resolve the issues bilaterally.

I affirm our commitment to combat the IUU fishing conduct by Sri Lanka fishing vessels in the region.

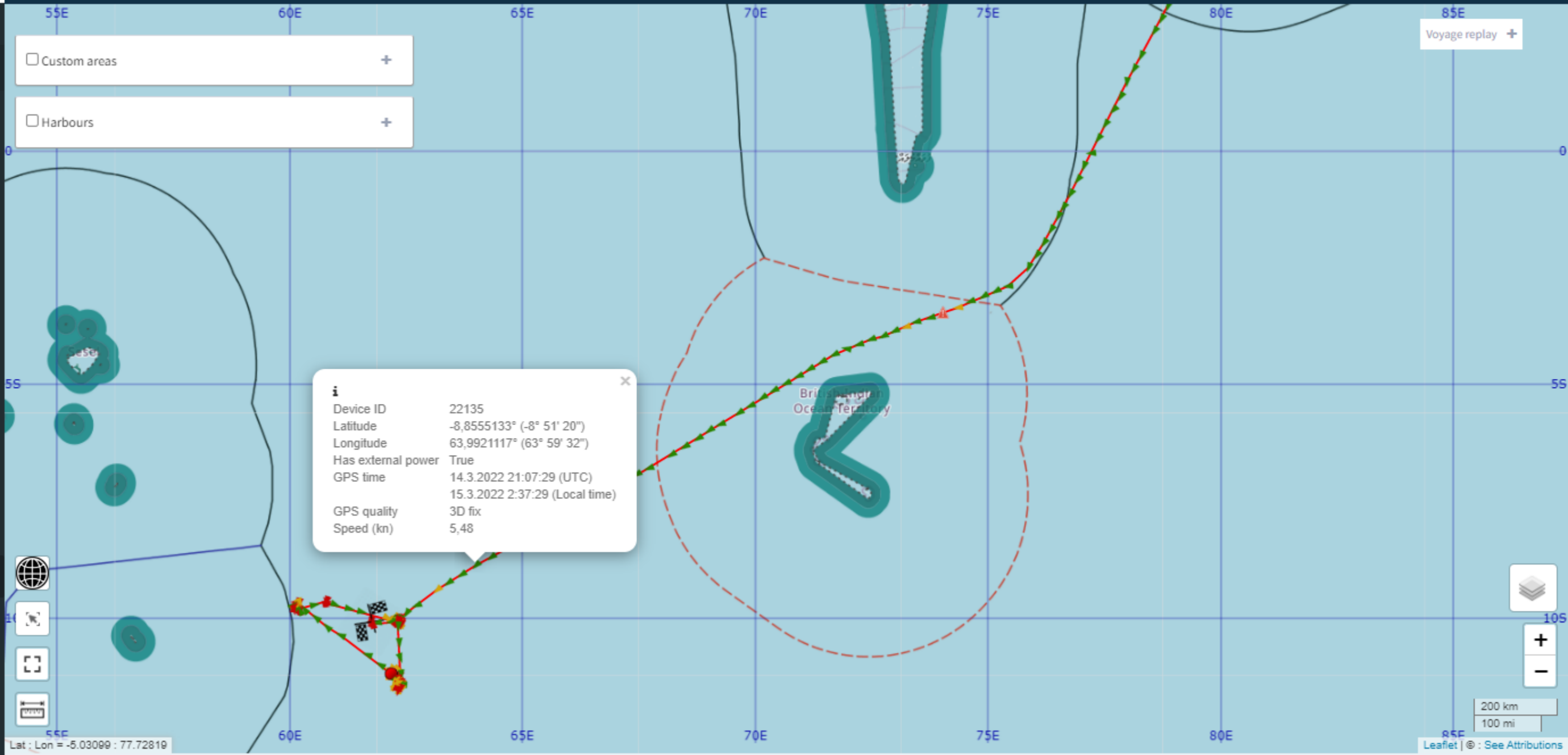

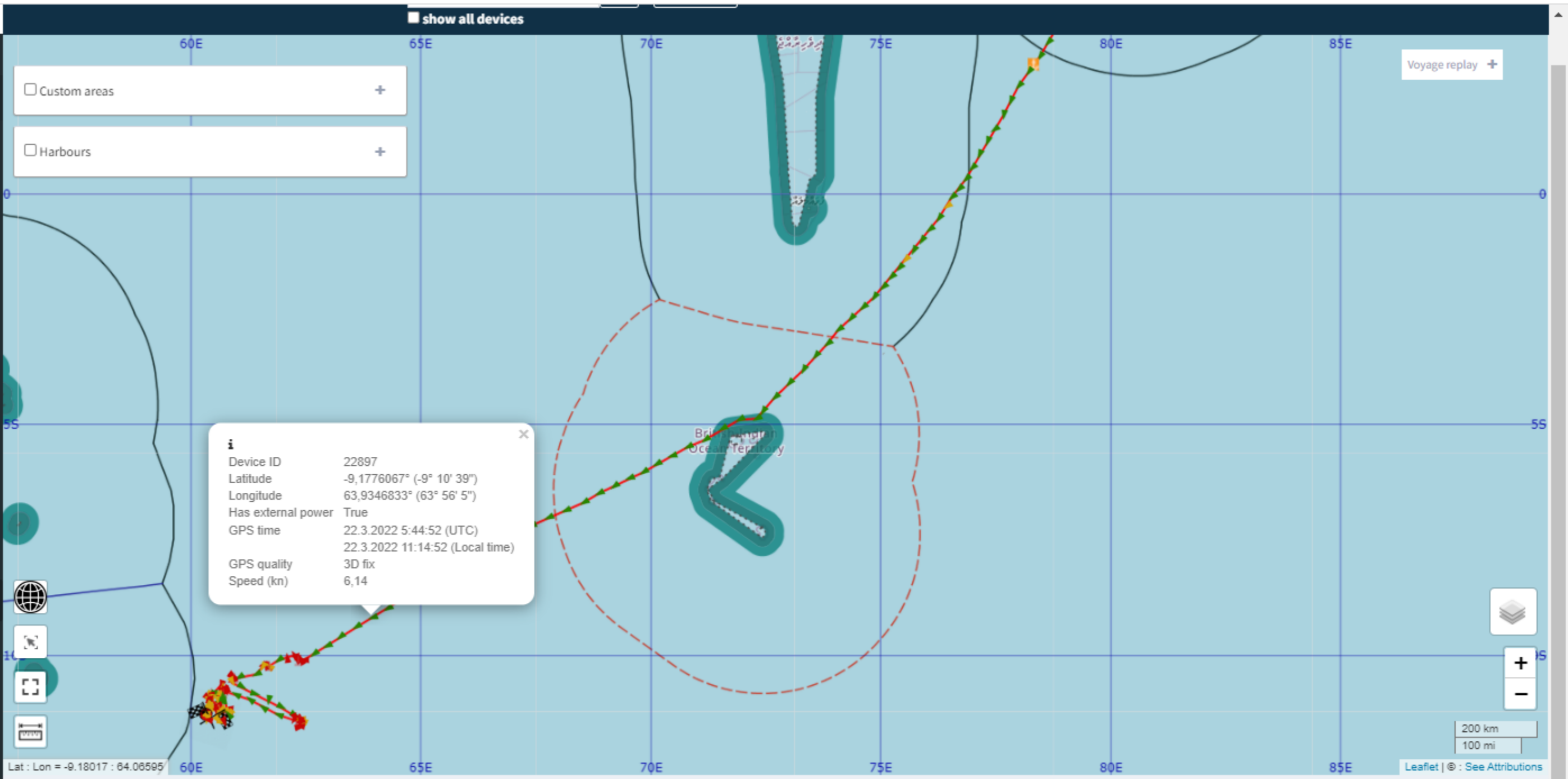

Thanking you for yours below.

Please be advised that pursuant to our Conservation and Management Measure on the Listing of IUU Vessels (CMM 2022/06), **only the flag state** of the vessel may request the removal of the El Shaddai provided that:

- (a) the vessel did not engage in any of the IUU fishing; or
- (b) effective action has been taken in response to the IUU fishing in question, including, inter alia, prosecution, and imposition of sanctions of adequate severity; and
- (c) the vessel is able to comply with all relevant and adopted SIOFA CMMs.

Further to the above, the flag state may request the removal of the vessel from the IUU Vessel List, including during the intersessional period, provided that the above conditions are met and more specifically by submitting suitably documented information that:

- (a) it has adopted measures that will ensure that the vessel complies with all relevant and adopted CMMs; and
- (b) it is and will continue to assume effectively its responsibilities as regards the monitoring and control of the vessel's fishing activities in the Area; and either
- (c) it has taken effective action in response to the IUU fishing that resulted in the vessel's inclusion in the IUU Vessel List, including prosecution and imposition of sanctions of adequate severity; or
- (d) the vessel has changed ownership and that the new owner can establish that the previous owner no longer has any legal, financial or real interests in the vessel or exercises control over it, and that the new owner has not participated in IUU fishing.

Extract of CC6 report about IMULA 1655 MTR and IMULA 1783 MTR

57. In relation to the IMULA 1655 MTR and the IMULA 1783 MTR,

a. The Executive Secretary informed the Compliance Committee that Sri Lanka notified the Secretariat on the first day of the Compliance Committee meeting that the two vessels were targeting tuna and tuna-like species and have not engaged in other fisheries, and submitted the logbooks of the vessels. The Cook Islands noted that it was unclear whether the flag state had verified the logbook information.

b. The European Union noted that the logbook information for IMULA 1655 MTR submitted by Sri Lanka suggested that the vessel has violated IOTC regulations including in relation to mobulid rays.

c. The European Union noted that the logbook information for IMULA 1783 MTR submitted by Sri Lanka is not consistent with the AIS tracking that the European Union has provided to SIOFA and wished to receive information from Sri Lanka that would clarify this discrepancy.

d. The European Union and the Cook Islands noted that there was insufficient information to conclude that the vessels have not been targeting SIOFA species and recalled that it is the responsibility of the flag CCPs to confirm that no IUU fishing took place.

58. The Compliance Committee noted that the IMULA 1655 MTR and the IMULA 1783 MTR are not on the SIOFA record of authorised vessels and were presumed to have engaged in fishing within the SIOFA Area. However, some CCPs considered that the matter falls in the IOTC jurisdiction and is outside the SIOFA responsibility. The Compliance Committee could not reach consensus to include the IMULA 1655 MTR and the IMULA 1783 MTR on the provisional SIOFA IUU vessel list.

59. The Compliance Committee agreed to retain the vessels on the draft SIOFA IUU vessel list for its consideration at its next meeting and requested Sri Lanka to provide further information such as observer data, port inspection reports, landing/sale notes, and transshipment declarations.

Extract of MoP9 report about IMULA (paragraphs 54 to 59)

54. Regarding the IMULA 1844 MTR, some CCPs were of the view that there was a lack of evidence to indicate that the vessel targeted SIOFA fishery resources, that Sri Lanka has taken effective action by prosecuting the vessel, and that the vessel should remain on the Draft SIOFA IUU Vessel List to give Sri Lanka more time to provide further information to SIOFA. Other CCPs were of the view that it is the responsibility of the flag State to prove that a vessel suspected of IUU fishing has not done so, that Sri Lanka has not provided adequate information to SIOFA despite being given much time to do so, that it is not clear if the vessel is being prosecuted in relation to the presumed case of IUU fishing or an unrelated matter, and that the vessel has not met the conditions for removal from the Provisional IUU Vessel List as provided in paragraphs 14 and 15 of CMM 2018/06 (IUU Vessel List).

55. The Meeting of the Parties requested the Secretariat to contact Sri Lanka and encourage it to provide the relevant information.

56. The Secretariat contacted Sri Lanka and received the reply that Sri Lanka was unable to attend the meeting because of a scheduling conflict and that the charge that has been brought against the IMULA 1844 MTR is “Conducting fishing operations without a valid fishing operation in high seas”.

57. Some CCPs were in favour of including the vessel on the final SIOFA IUU Vessel List. One CCP objected to the inclusion.

58. The Meeting of the Parties was unable to reach consensus to include the IMULA 1844 MTR on the final SIOFA IUU Vessel List.

59. The Meeting of the Parties noted that the IMULA 1844 MTR would remain on the Draft SIOFA IUU Vessel List for consideration by the Compliance Committee at its next meeting.

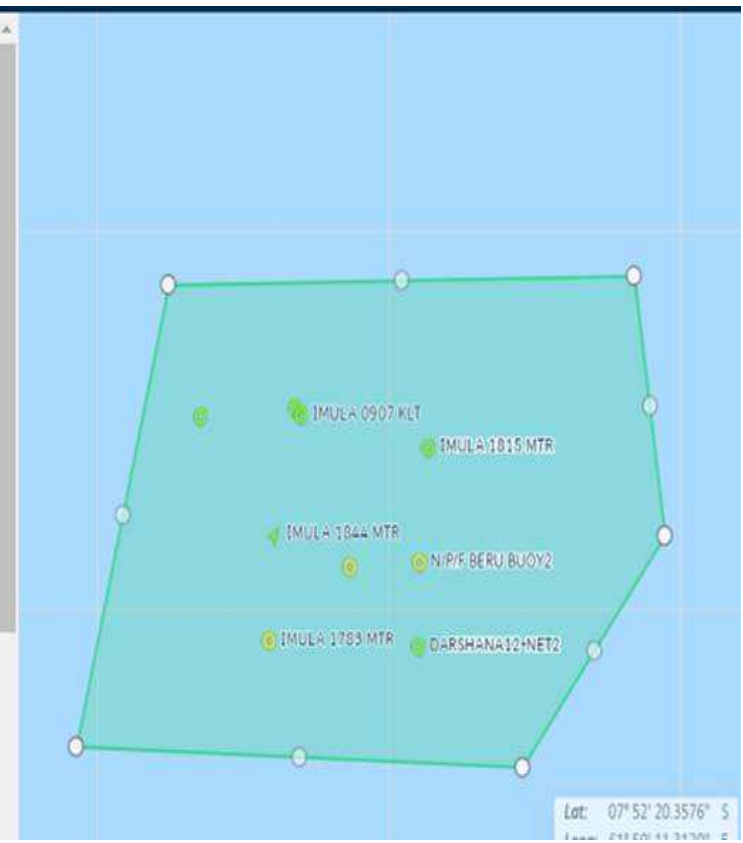

This is reference to your letter NO. 2022-04-06-01-ES dated 6th April 2022 on the above.

Department of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources Sri Lanka conducted an analysis on the three vessels (IMULA 1783 MTR, IMULA 1844 MTR and IMULA 1655MTR) based on the AIS data provided. The vessel registration, Operation licenses Departure forms and the VMS track were inspected to find the reasons for inclusion of these vessels in the SIOFA draft IUU list 2022.

The all three vessels are duly registered fishing vessels of Sri Lanka as per the provisions of the Fisheries and Aquatic Resources Act No. 02, and present in the National Vessel registry of Sri Lanka. IMULA 1783 MTR and IMULA 1655 MTR are vessels operate for tuna fishing in high seas, Equipped with VMS on board and authorized at IOTC to operate in IOTC area of competence. .

However the fishing vessel IMULA 1844 MTR is permitted to operate within EEZ of Sri Lanka and allegedly entered to High Seas. This Department investigated on this matter and has already taken actions to prosecute the vessel owner for deploying the vessel for high seas tuna fishing without a valid license, based on the electronic evidence (AIS track) provided by SIOFA.

Sri Lanka nationals engage in tuna fisheries in the Western Indian Ocean from the ancient times, especially in the area of Saya de Malha Bank, close to the Mauritius. The gears they use are, long line and Gill nets. In the meantime Sri Lanka nationals have no interest of demersal fish species in high seas those comes under the scope of SIOFA. There are no catch recordings nor landing of such species by the vessels operate in the said sea area.

Sri Lanka being a member of IOTC authorize the vessels to operate in the high seas of the western Indian Ocean. Moreover the fisheries authority (DFAR) of Sri Lanka does not hesitate to take legal actions against the fishers who engage in IUU fishing activities violating the national legislations established in the country, based on the international conventions and regional resolutions.

In the section A, item (i) of the provided information by SIOFA, it is mentioned that *“presence of the vessel in the immediate vicinity of the Saya de Malha Bank, indicating that the vessel may have been engaging in fishing activities falling under the purview of SIOFA”*.

In the Section B, item (a) , it is mentioned that “engaged in fishing for fishery resources in the Agreement Area and are not on the SIOFA Record of Authorized Vessels and item (i) “engaged in fishing activities contrary to any other SIOFA CMMS”.


We are have a question, how a vessel being in the area of SIOFA, indicates that the vessels engaged in fishing for the species comes under the scope of SIOFA without real time proven evidence . The DFAR checked the log sheets and the catch landed on arrival and found that no demersal species on board of the three vessels reported by SIOFA.

Sri Lanka is not a CCP and nor vessels of Sri Lanka are in the SIOFA Record of Authorized list, because Sri Lanka vessels are not harvesting the demersal species those manage by SIOFA. In the meantime Due to the late submission of the authorized list of vessels to IOTC Secretariat the two vessels IMULA 1783 MTR and IMULA 1655 MTR are not updated on the authorized list of IOTC. Since the vessel list has been submitted, the two vessels are now on the ALVs of IOTC bearing IOTC number 18106 and 18117 respectively.

I think this clarification is sufficient for you to proceed ahead in the SIOFA to remove the said vessels from the CIOFA draft IUU list based on our clarifications given. In the meantime I would like to bring to your kind notice that though the competent areas of the IOTC and SIOFA are overlapped The fisheries conducted are separate. Therefore without valid, real time, proven evidences it is not reasonable to recommend inclusion of fishing vessels operate in high seas for IUU listing. Sri Lanka is ready to communicate with any reporting country on the IUU fishing activities conducted by vessels fagged to Sri Lanka, to the resolve the issues bilaterally.

I affirm our commitment to combat the IUU fishing conduct by Sri Lanka fishing vessels in the region.

Dear Madam

I acknowledge receipt of your reply regarding the three Sri Lankan flagged vessels alleged to have engaged in IUU fishing in the SIOFA area.

I would like to draw your attention to the fact that the SIOFA agreement covers fisheries resources, including fish, molluscs, crustaceans and other sedentary species in the area, but excludes highly migratory species (Annex I of UNCLOS) and sedentary species subject to restrictions (UNCLOS Annex I) and sedentary species subject to the fisheries jurisdiction of coastal States (UNCLOS Article 77(4)).

This means that SIOFA is competent for all fish species, except the excluded species mentioned above.

I will inform the Chairman of the Compliance Committee and the Head of Delegation of the Meeting of the Parties of your letter of response.

It will be up to the MoP during to decide whether these vessels should be maintained or deleted from the SIOFA IUU vessel list. A proposal will be done at the end of the Compliance Committee to the MoP who has to confirm the registration on the IUU List or not.

Our rules of procedure allow you to register as an observer at the next meeting which could take place physically and/or virtually in La Réunion, between 28 June and 8 July 2022.
