# Summary report on Entry-Exit notifications received at the Secretariat

<b>Abstract</b>	<p>CMM 2019/10 on monitoring requires CCPs to provide the Secretariat with every vessel entry to and exit from the Agreement Area. The Secretariat collects all reports and merges them into a dedicated database.</p> <p>A summary of notifications provided in 2022 is provided in this document. Refer to the previous report (CC-06-INFO-02) for the notifications received prior to this date.</p>

## Introduction

The Meeting of the Parties developed rules and procedures for the monitoring, control, and surveillance of fishing activities to ensure compliance with CMMs.

CMM 2019/10 describes the measures for the Monitoring of Fisheries in the Agreement. In 2018 a new paragraph about vessel entry and exit notifications was added:

### Entry- Exit reports

14. Contracting Parties, CNPCs and PFEs shall require their vessels or relevant authorities to notify the Secretariat, by email or other means, within **24 hours**, in the format provided in Annex I, of each **entry to** or **exit from** the Agreement Area of vessels authorised to fish for species managed by SIOFA flying its flag, in accordance with CMM 2019/07.

The entry and exit notifications shall contains the following information in accordance with Annex I of CMM 2019/10 Monitoring.

1-vessels: number of fishing or transiting vessels (total number of vessels that have provided reports)

2-fishing: number of vessels which notify entry or exit for actual fishing

3->24h account the number of notifications received more than 24 hours after the entry or exit event. Two notifications were received one hour late, and one was due to an internet connection issue.

4-Anomalies: account when 2 consecutive entries or exits are reported.

a: 14 notifications from CT were sent on time (<24h) but reached the secretariat inbox later. Mail servers' delays may be the reason for this. Only 2 notifications were sent after the 24h delay.

### Conclusion

Most entry and exit notifications were received timely and very few anomalies have been identified. The few anomalies are trying to be solved.

Note that Mauritius entry-exit reports were not reported at the event time but were all provided at once in December 2022. Now, they are reported on a regular basis.
