Southern Indian Ocean Fisheries Agreement Accord relatif aux Pêches dans le Sud de l'Océan Indien

Background

Following discussions at the Seventh Meeting of the Compliance Committee of the Southern Indian Ocean Fisheries Agreement (CC07), the CC and the MoP agreed to continue discussions related to a new CCP Compliance Report (CCR) Template intersessionally based on the two templates that were presented to the committee. To recap, there were two proposed methods for the assessment of some of the obligations in the SIOFA CMMs, which suggests the establishment of relevant domestic measures by CCPs to ensure compliance by intended subjects (vessels, nationals, ports, etc..). CCPs may further recall discussions related to the assessment criteria for these obligations, where there was no agreed consensus on the assessment criteria, and consequently the CCR template to be used for the collection of data on compliance, for assessment by the Compliance Committee.

Following this, CCPs convened on the 14th of December 2023 to discuss the new template in detail, including one of the main points of discussion at CC07 and MoP10, which was the methodology to assess obligations that may require implementing national binding measures.

At the conclusion of the meeting, CCPs agreed that they would need more time to work on the template and, therefore, agreed to provide comments on the discussion paper (CCRT01-01), which would serve as the basis for a revision thereof. The meeting also noted the divergent views among CCPs regarding the assessment methodologies for some obligations.

This paper summarises the comments received during and after the 1st meeting and the amendments to the discussion paper.

Summary of Comments

At the 1st Meeting on the Southern Indian Ocean Fisheries Agreement (SIOFA) CCPs Compliance Report Template (CCRT-01) CCPs expressed their views on the proposed template. One key discussion point was related to the assessment methodology for obligations that places obligations on CCPs to implement national domestic measures in relation to these obligations.

During the CCRT01, Australia was of the view that such obligations are to be assessed based on the domestic measures established by CCPs, including the implementation into domestic law of these obligations. However, Australia was also of the view that the reporting of these measures must be streamlined and that CCPs should be required to report these measures once and only report any changes to those measures after that. Australia also proposed that the justification of Non-Applicability should be left to be defined by the CCPs rather than the template suggesting a rationale.

However the (EU) expressed concern with focusing exclusively on how CCPs implement their SIOFA obligations internally. The EU noted the need to ensure a level playing field in terms of compliance assessment between CCPs, recalling that English is the working language of the Organization, that the internal measures of some CCPs are not available in English and that the Secretariat's ability to understand measures implemented by CCPs in languages other than English was limited. The EU also considered that the SIOFA CMMs do not specify how CCPs are to implement their obligations internally and that assessing CCPs' internal frameworks went beyond the Secretariat's mandate and ability, noting that other RFMOs do not require CCPs to report on their internal implementation of obligations while using the same language to prescribe action by CCPs (e.g., 'shall ensure', 'shall take measures'). The EU further noted that rules and processes, while implemented internally, are not necessarily implemented on the ground. Therefore, an approach focusing solely or mainly on the internal implementation by CCPs of their obligations may mean that instances of non-compliance on



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the ground are not detected. The EU expressed that it is more important to understand what vessels are doing on the ground and how CCPs respond to instances of non-compliance.

Other comments received during the CCRT-01 suggested ways on how also to improve and streamline the template.

Following the conclusion of the CCRT01, the Secretariat received additional comments on how to improve the CCR template. CCPs also stated their preference with regard to the assessment methodology for obligations that may require the implementation of national binding measures. There were some minor comments on how the compliance assessment process can be streamlined or made more robust.

The main comments received on the template are as follows:

- SIOFA parties should report on the implementation of SIOFA obligations (such as nationally binding measures), however, reporting should be simplified and avoid duplication.
- Proposal for CCPs to provide the Secretariat copies of any nationally binding measures used to implement their SIOFA obligations, both in their original languages and in English translations, where possible (although not required as some legal documents may be too long to reasonably translate). The instruments should be accompanied by a brief summary of their contents and relevance in English. Statements of implementation could then refer back to these instruments, providing the text from the relevant paragraph and/or clause, including citation. This will save time for CCPs as they only need to submit the instruments once and only provide updates to the Secretariat when necessary.
- Proposal to justify "Not Applicable" obligations.
- Review the questions to be coherent and consistent throughout the template. Also to ensure that language used within the template is aligned with obligations in CMMs
- Assessment of sub-paragraphs individually, instead of grouping them by paragraphs
- That the template is updated to reflect obligations to be assessed in 2025, i.e. entered into force after the 1st of January 2024.
- In some cases, CCPs were of the view that some obligations were to be assessed on both the national binding measures implemented and the activities related to these obligations.

The comments received during the meeting and after its conclusions were incorporated in a Rev1 of the discussion paper, which was circulated to CCPs for further comments.

Comments on the Rev1 were largely positive, noting improvements to the template. Notwithstanding, CCPs provided further inputs on the templates, which includes:

- Exclusion of report submission dates on the template
- Minor drafting suggestions for some provisions
- Further alignment, improving coherence and consistency of questions to the provisions
- Further work on ensuring that sub-paragraphs are assessed individually
- Proposal not to introduce new requirements to justify Non- applicability (*Not Applicable-Please provide an explanation*)

As the discussion paper included both assessment methodologies, some CCPs noted their preference when submitting their comments. Some CCPs supported the assessment based on implementing domestic measures by CCPs where applicable, with one elaborating that if the obligation is read "Each CCP shall..." (or similar language is used), the subject to be assessed should be on the CCP level instead of an individual fishing vessel.



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One CCP reiterated its concern related to the approach to assessing the implementation of SIOFA obligations. The CCP was of the view that Rev1 does not bring SIOFA closer to achieving the objectives set for the revision process, which were simplification, increased consistency and coherence, and reduced burden on CCPs. The CCP believed that the revised template is moving away from these objectives stressing the need for an approach that ensures the equal treatment of CCPs.

Another CCP provided its views on the mandate of SIOFA vis-a-vis pelagic longliners with respect to paragraph 6 of CMM 13 (2022),¹ which is that certain pelagic fisheries are under the scope of SIOFA such as sauries (Scomberesocidae), but SIOFA pelagic species are caught using other gear (otter trawl, handline) not pelagic longline (which targets tuna and billfish).

Rev1a of the Proposed CCR Template

Further to revisions made in Rev1, the Secretariat has, taking into consideration all comments received from CCPs, updated the Rev1 to Rev1a with the following changes:

- Further improvements have been made to ensure the alignment, consistency and coherence of the document vis-à-vis the obligations
- "Not Applicable- Please provide an explanation" bracketed for discussion at the next meeting
- Removal of data submission dates
- More provisions have been updated so that sub-paragraphs can be assessed individually

Other drafting suggestions made by CCPs are also included in the *track change* version of the document.

To further facilitate the discussion, while the format of the discussion paper remains unchanged (i.e., presenting both assessment methodologies), we have annexed two CCR templates with each proposed approach presented separately, with <u>Annex A</u> presenting the template with the assessments of concerned obligations based on implementation of national measures, and <u>Annex B</u> focusing on vessels compliance with CMMs.

Conclusion

Based on the above, CCPs are welcome to comment on the new working document and continue discussions on which assessment methodology to adopt for obligations that may require the implementation of national binding measures.
