## **SIOFA Secretariat**

## Abstract

CMM 2018/10 on monitoring requires CCPs to provide the Secretariat with every vessels entry to and exit from the Agreement Area.

A summary of these notifications is provided for Compliance Committee consideration. Many CCPs did not provide the Secretariat with any notifications. Confirmation that these CCPs did not enter the Area, or did not comply with this requirement, could be useful.

#### Introduction

The Meeting of the Parties developed rules and procedures for the monitoring, control and surveillance of fishing activities in order to ensure compliance with CMMs.

CMM 2018/10 (supersedes CMM 2017/10) describes the measures for the Monitoring of Fisheries in the Agreement. In 2018 a new paragraph about vessel entry and exit notifications was added as follows;

## Entry- Exit reports

14. Contracting Parties, CNPCs and PFEs shall require their vessels or relevant authorities to notify the Secretariat, by email or other means, within **24 hours**, in the format provided in Annex I, of each **entry to** or **exit from** the Agreement Area of vessels authorised to fish for species managed by SIOFA flying its flag, in accordance with CMM 2017/07.

The entry and exit notifications shall contains the following information in accordance with Annex I of CMM 2018/10 Monitoring.

## Conclusions

Many CCP do not provide notifications unless none of their vessels have entered or left the area since October 2018.

When notifications are received, most are received within 24 hours and compliant in this regard. A misunderstanding between the fisheries department and a vessel owner from EU Spain was the reason for late notifications from EU, this misunderstanding has now been resolved. Not all notifications provide activity information on entry or on exit.
